Leading Your Church into Growth (LYCiG)

Porirua Anglicans have been engaging with this Church Growth Resource during the last four months. Unashamedly, growth in numbers attending church gatherings is one of the outcomes envisaged; the Course is very much about personal spiritual growth and community awareness about the processes that attract Christian engagement and those that count against it. The Resource offers seven sessions broadly defined as:

- 1. Creating a prayerful culture of growth
- 2. Implementing an annual rhythm of growth
- 3. Practicing fruitful evangelism
- 4. Developing engaging worship
- 5. Becoming an inviting and welcoming church
- 6. Making a pathway for seekers to become disciples
- 7. Planning for a Journey for Growth

The process is all about considering next steps on the Christian spiritual journey for the people with whom we engage personally and corporately. Throughout participants are invited to observe how people respond and not to be afraid of change when we notice this or that is not producing engagement or growth. Addressing the need for engaging

Lent—Personal Spiritual Renewal

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on 14 February and ends with Maundy Thursday on 28 March. During this **40 day season of personal spiritual renewal** we are invited to go deeper with God. 40 is a significant number in the Bible: In Genesis, the flood which destroyed the earth was brought about by 40 days and nights of rain. The Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness before reaching the promised land. Moses fasted for 40 days before receiving the ten commandments on Mount Sinai. Jesus spent 40 days praying and fasting in the wilderness in preparation for his ministry.


Recently, on 2 February in our Friday service we read of Jesus' presentation in the Jerusalem temple 40 days after his birth. On this occasion we read (Luke 2:22-40) that sacrifices were made by Jesus' parents. The righteous and devout Simeon and prayerful Anna who had long waited prayerfully for the coming Messiah were there, and recognised He had arrived in Jesus. They gave special thanks in their excitement after waiting so long.

A 40 day waiting on God will inevitably lead to **personal spiritual renewal and revelation** as Simeon and Anna found. Let us keep the Lenten disciplines of:

- · Fasting—maybe refraining from eating some food or other activity
- Digging deeper in Prayer
- · Scripture reading, mediation and reflection
- · Aligning our lives with God's love

Let us pray together that Lent 2024 will be a special time for Porirua Anglicans as we fast and walk with the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. During Lent we will be

informed by the Diocesan provided study guide:



Jesus is the true vine. Who are we?

Reflection on 2023

At our AGM in February 2023 a decision was taken to move Porirua Anglican life and ministry to te Whare Karakia on Mungavin Avenue for a trial period from May-October 2023. In the process we closed St Anne's Pantry just before Easter.

Since the transition to te Whare Karakia new worship routines have been established, post worship morning tea fellowship has enhanced the community life, weekly Wednesday prayer meetings and Friday worship and lunch have become vital features of Porirua Anglican life, gaining increased support.

During this period, parishioners have attended two Diocesan Training Days, kept May as a Celebration Month focusing on TKC, including a Sunday Day of Prayer. Terry attended the three day LYCiG conference and subsequently re-presented this material during seven Sunday morning services Nov-Feb.

Towards the end of June guitar backing for singing was introduced with Charles Nikora & Margaret Alve leading. In December Stuart McClaren began leading some Sunday services using a portable organ. We had a Matariki focus. We remembered St Anne and we celebrated the first anniversary of Sala's passing, and recently her unveiling. In July three of us began participating in an ALPHA Group in Johnsonville. The ALPHA Day was held in te Whare Karakia and Porirua Anglicans catered. Subsequently we began an ALPHA Course in January 2024 at te Whare with 7 participating.

On Sunday 15 October an SGM confirmed that te Whare Karakia will permanently be our Centre. During Advent-Christmas-New Year we had an intentional service, fellowship and celebratory series of events which were promoted widely in the community. All this activity has decidedly warmed up the life of Porirua Anglicans with a result that mid-week gatherings regularly attract 5-8 attendees and during Jan-Feb 2024 Sunday attendance has average 16-17, up from 12-13 earlier in 2023.

Future of St Anne's

At a recent meeting at St Anne's the Diocesan Administrator and Property Manager met with Porirua Anglican PIC, Wardens and Property overseer. A wide ranging, helpful discussion paved the way forward.

Subsequently the Vestry have passed a series of motions inviting the Diocese to commence the process of selling the St Anne's site. Proceeds from the sale will be held in trust for future mission and ministry in the Parish area.
